


Study for the GED with LearningExpress Library

It also includes a Job Search & Workplace Skills Learning Center, where you can create your own resume.




Visit the library's website

- Go to www.pueblolibrary.org.
- Hold your mouse over "Search."
- Then click on "eResources."



Choose an eResource


Click on "Test Preparation."



Open LearningExpress Library

Click on "LearningExpress Library."

If using LearningExpress Library outside of the library, you will be prompted for your library card number. Enter the number on the back of your library card starting with 122220.... and click "login."



Login to LearningExpress Library

New Users:

If you are using LearningExpress Library for the first time, click "Register." Use your library card number as your username and your 8digit birth date as your password.

Returning User Sign-In

If you have already created an account in LearningExpress Library, enter your user name and password and click "Login."

Use the blue arrows to navigate to High School Equivalency Center. Click on it to enter.

Build Your Basic Skills – Practice tests, e-books and tutorials



Test your Skills


Click "Are You Ready?"



There are two sets of Skills Checks. After you complete Set 1, you can click on Skills Check: Set 2.

Choose a skills test and click "Launch."





Like the official TABE 9/10, Level A Applied Mathematics subtest, this practice test will assess how well you can solve complicated math problems like those found in everyday life. Topics covered include analyzing data from charts and graphs, measurement, geometry, algebra, and problem


When you complete this practice test, you will receive a comprehensive score report and recommendations to guide your preparation for the math portion of your high school equivalency

Mark your answer by clicking on the circle next to your choice

Changing Your Answers

Before clicking SCORE MY TEST, you can change your answer to any question by clicking on a new answer choice. Once you score your test, you will not be able to change answers.



Choose your test mode: Simulation: The test is timed just like an actual test.

Practice: This test will show a timer, but you can take as long as you need to.

Learner: This test displays the correct answers as you go through the test.

When you are ready, click "Start Test."


Once you finish the test, it will be scored and you will not be able to make changes to it.







Click on "My Center" from any screen to return to your portfolio.




Click on "Center Home" to return to the main page of the High School Equivalency Center.



Build your Skills


Click on "Build Your Basic Skills."

Choose an exercise and click "Launch."




Choose your test mode.

Choose "Practice" to see the answers at the end of the set of questions.


Choose a test mode and click "Start Test."
