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About Us

Mission

Posada's mission is to provide housing and supportive services that empower homeless individuals and families in Pueblo County to become self-supporting members of the community.

Values and Beliefs

- Posada recognizes and works to enhance the inherent dignity and value of each human being.
- Posada believes that each human being has a right to decent shelter, food and clothing.
- Posada believes that homelessness can be reduced only if underlying causes are addressed, including the lack of affordable housing and the need for a continuum of services to help clients reach the stability needed for independent living.
- Posada's priority is to secure the services and housing that its clients need, whether provided by Posada or through the network of agencies available in Pueblo and the surrounding area.
- Posada builds and rehabilitates housing for those in the lowest income brackets, housing that does not overlap with what private builders usually supply.
- Posada also has trained case managers to aide homeless clients applying for AND and Social Security benefits. It is critical that a case manager assist the client with initial application process.

Rapid Re-Housing

- 2-year program for families with children
- Rent is paid for 2 years while in program

Permanent Housing

- Documented permanent disability

Tenant-Based Rental Assistance

- Deposit and 1 year of rent paid
- Lease contract strictly between tenant and landlord
- Case management

Homeless Youth Outreach

- Case Management and Advocacy
- Employment and Education Assistance
- Basic needs, transportation, medical and mental health care, food, community shower and laundry facility on-site and clothing
- Youth Drop-in Center open Monday-Friday from 8am to noon
- Housing vouchers and limited emergency shelter

Emergency Solutions Grant

- Rapid rehousing for homeless households
- Deposit, rent and utility assistance
- Limited funds—please see a case manager

Goals for 2018

Provide emergency shelter to 120 families.

Provide prevention services to more than 50 households.

Provide transitional and permanent housing to more than 40 households

Maintain 32 site based vouchers for homeless veterans low-income individuals.

Maintain 40 units of low-income permanent housing in Posada's Rio Sacramento apartments and 8 additional units dedicated for low-income individuals

Provide permanent supportive housing for transitional aged youth at 2105 Norman Lane

Serve 280 unaccompanied youth in Pueblo County by providing case management, outreach and supportive services through the Moving-Up Center

Serve 1,500 unduplicated individuals with supportive services

Provide medical respite care and emergency shelter and referrals for the newly homeless 24-7 in cooperation with the Pueblo Police and Sheriff's Departments

Organize and sponsor Pueblo's Petra McCulley Memorial and Take Care Fair (1,200 people served) Homeless Veterans' Stand Down (72 Homeless Veterans.) Coordinate Pueblo's Regional Continuum of Care Group
