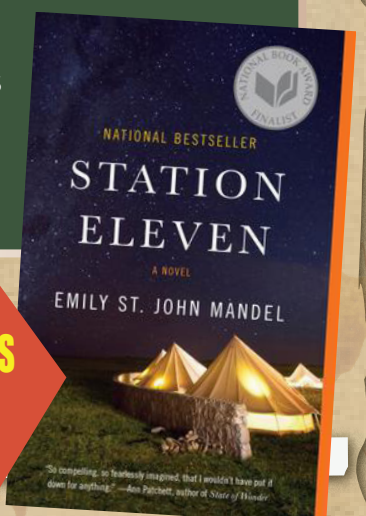
From typewriters to telephones, these historic photos provide a glimpse into how Pueblo's offices and work spaces have changed over time.
